Overview

Being the first meeting of the MVCD SIAP following the recent SIAP selection process, Hort Innovation provided an induction for panel members outlining the objectives, governance and scope of operation of the panel. During that presentation, an overview of the Hort Innovation funding model, innovation process and procurement framework was also provided.

The panel also participated in an independently facilitated strategic planning workshop to assist with the development of the vegetable industry Strategic Investment Plan (SIP). The workshop builds on the advice received through workshops and one-on-one discussions with growers over the past two months.

The panel discussed the outputs from the current projects on the feasibility study on wholesale market prices and the draft Vegetable Industry Export Strategy. This was conducted prior to the panel reviewing and providing advice on nine new concepts.

Next steps

Further SIP workshops in Queensland, NSW and Victoria will be conducted early in 2017 prior to a draft being produced for review for further industry comment and feedback. Our aim is to have a final vegetable industry SIP for the Horticulture Convention at Adelaide in May 2017.
