Products to be used:

NOGALL (APVMA No. 39304)

Containing: 1,000 million *Rhizobium rhizogenes* strain K1026/g peat as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Disease	Rate
<i>Rubus</i> spp.	Crown gall (<i>Agrobacterium tumefaciens</i>)	20 g/L

Critical Use Comments:

- Completely immerse root systems in solution before planting.

Withholding Period:

Not required when used as directed.

Storage and Disposal:

If any dip solution is excess, add approximately 50 ml household bleach per 1 L, stir thoroughly and allow to react for approximately 4 hours prior to disposal.

Jurisdiction:

All States and Territories, except VIC.

Note: Victoria is not included in this permit, as their Control-of-Use legislation means a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in that State.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.
